Riparian Protection in Sheridan County

Sheridan County is working to identify the regulations needed to protect riparian areas in the County.

Riparian areas are the transition zones between land and water environments. They are the narrow strips of land located along lakes, creeks, streams, potholes, springs or anywhere water is plentiful. The abundance of water and plant communities, which are different from the drier uplands, sets riparian areas apart from their surroundings.

Riparian areas are a productive and a valuable resource that provides a number of functions including wildlife habitat and migration corridors, improvement of water quality through filtering and storage, and visual benefits.
