The Board of County Commissioners of Sheridan County, Wyoming met in Special Session at the time and place above-mentioned. Members present were Commissioner Ky Dixon and Commissioner Lawrence A. Durante. Chairman Terry Cram was absent. Commissioner Dixon called the meeting to order and then led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### SHERIDAN COUNTY AIRPORT

As duly advertised as a public hearing, the Board considered a Resolution to authorize the submittal of a grant application for the construction of a fuel storage facility at the Sheridan County Airport. Only Business Manager Renee Obermueller and Airport Manager John Stopka spoke to this issue. Mr. Stopka said the Airport currently uses holding tanks owned by Bighorn Airways located on Sheridan County property, which no longer meet standards and which will be razed upon the construction of new holding tanks. He said the national rules governing fuel storage have been tightened. Among many other requirements, holding tanks must have double-hulls and secondary containment areas where Airport fuel trucks would also be required to park. Ms. Obermueller said that the Airport's fuel storage facility regulations are mandated by Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality Chapter 17 rules and the Airport must be in compliance prior to October 2007.

Commissioner Dixon said this project was originally included in the County's submittal for impact funding, however, due to reductions in funding allocations and probable cost increases in construction caused by delayed funding through Chapter 21 impact funding rules, the County is now submitting a request for emergency funding. The Board approved Resolution 06-09-024, authorizing the submission of a grant application to the State Loan and Investment Board under Chapter 20 rules, requesting emergency funding in the amount of \$663,000, and authorized Commissioner Durante to sign all required documents.

#### HIGH LINE DITCH IRRIGATION DISTRICT

The Board approved an Official Bond and Oath for the Treasurer of High Line Ditch Irrigation District, in the coverage amount of \$5,000, for a term ending September 27, 2007.

#### CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

The Board proclaimed the month of September as Childhood Cancer Awareness Month to recognize the efforts or organizations to benefit children with cancer.

#### PROCLAMATION

##### Childhood Cancer Awareness Month

WHEREAS, an estimated 13,000 children will be diagnosed with cancer each year; and  
WHEREAS, cancer is the leading cause of death by disease in children under age 15; and  
WHEREAS, the incidence of cancer among children in the United States is rising by about one percent each year; and  
WHEREAS, while some progress has been made, a number of opportunities for childhood cancer research still remain unfunded or underfunded; and  
WHEREAS, limited resources for childhood cancer research can hinder the recruitment of investigators and physicians to pediatric oncology;

WHEREAS, the number of survivors of childhood cancers continues to grow, with about 1 in 640 adults between ages 20 to 39 who have a history of cancer; and that up to two-thirds of childhood cancer survivors are likely to experience at least one late effect from treatment, many of which may be life-threatening.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Sheridan County Commissioners that we encourage public and private sector efforts to promote awareness about the incidence of cancer among children, the signs and symptoms of cancer in children, treatment options, long-term followup, and policies that promote medical education designed to improve pain management for cancer patients.

To recognize the efforts of organizations working for the benefit of children with cancer and their families, we proclaim September as Childhood Cancer Awareness Month.
